Can you store potatoes in a sealed container?

Whatever you do, don't store potatoes in a sealed container! Avoid closed containers like resealable plastic bags or airtight storage containers--they'll trap moisture and will cause the potatoes to mold, sprout, or spoil faster. You can easily store them in a paper bag or in an open bowl or basket.

Can you store potatoes in a plastic bag?

When you purchase potatoes at a store they typically come in either a perforated plastic bag or a mesh sack. If you store the potatoes in the plastic bag they come in, or place them in plastic sacks you poke holes in yourself, they will stay shelf stable a lot longer than you might think.

Can you store potatoes in a cardboard box?

A cool, dark basement is an ideal location for storing potatoes in a cardboard box. The consistent cool temperatures and lack of light contribute to a longer shelf life, maintaining potato firmness for up to six weeks. This method takes advantage of natural conditions, offering a convenient and effective solution for those with basement space.

How do you store potatoes after curing?

Post curing, you can store your potatoes in any container that allows for ventilation, such as a cardboard box, paper bag, or laundry basket. Avoid plastic because it leads to moisture retention. The potatoes can touch at this point, though many people find it helps to insulate them with a buffer material like shredded paper.

How do you store potatoes in a dark cabinet?

A paper bag in a dark cabinet is a simple yet effective method for storing potatoes. The breathable material allows air circulation while the darkness prevents sprouting, keeping potatoes fresh for over three weeks. This method offers the right balance of ventilation and light protection, making it a reliable choice for medium-term storage.

Can you store potatoes in a basement?

Unless or until you cannot build a root cellar to store potatoes, a basement will suffice. But, the key to keeping potatoes shelf stable in a root cellar-like environment is ensuring they are protected from both light and moisture - which can be extremely difficult in a basement.
