While you are browsing solar power companies, one of them may offer to install a solar panel or solar roof in your home for a small cost or even for free. It's an intentionally misleading claim ...

Watch out for scam ads offering cheap installation and maintenance. ... The Welsh Government initiative offers free energy-saving home improvements, including solar panels. ... (though again we have no feedback on its service). Here, Tomato Energy will install solar panels and/or a battery for free, but you pay a fixed monthly price (based on ...
