Are more solar panels better?

When most people start to think about solar power for their homes they may be under the impression that more solar panels are better. What very few people do...at least until they start to add up the costs of solar panels...is consider how many solar panels they "really" need.

How many solar panels can you have in the UK?

What's the maximum number of solar panels you can have in the UK? Assuming your property doesn't require planning permission for a solar installation, there is no legal maximum number of solar panels that you can install on your roof in the UK. Other than usable roof space, there is nothing limiting how many solar panels you can put up there.

How much does it cost to install solar panels?

In general, the solar installation company you use will help you determine the correct number of solar panels for your family's needs. However, you may overestimate your power consumption and end up with more panels than you need. Investing in solar power can cost upwards of \$25,000 for a typical home.

How many solar panels do I Need?

Do you need planning permission for solar panels?

Listed buildings and properties in conservation areas usually require planning permission for solar panels, but for the majority of other homes a solar installation counts as a 'permitted development'. However, it is a legal requirement of all rooftop solar panel installations that no panel sits closer than 400mm from the edge of the roof.

Are You on the fence about solar power?

Most people who are on the fence about solar power don't want to make a bad decision. They may be worried that too many panels will cost them more than they can afford or take up space where they need it for some reason. One thing to note is that some solar panels operate more efficiently than others...even ones from the same company.

Though there are still some grants for solar panels available, there's definitely less than what there used to be, mainly because solar panels are a lot cheaper to buy and install nowadays. The current government grant in operation is ECO4, which is an energy efficient scheme supporting low-income and vulnerable households.

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There are solar panels grants available to help you afford them. The popularity of solar panels is skyrocketing. You can expect a solar panel to keep at least 75% of its initial efficiency and, with proper care, it can remain operational for up to 30-40 years. Given the typical degradation rate of about 0.5-0.9% per year, a 10-year-old solar panel can be expected to keep 90-95% of its original efficiency.

Solar electric panels are also called photovoltaic (PV) panels, which means "able to produce electricity from light." Each panel is made up of PV cells that absorb particles of light from the sun (photons) that knock electrons loose from atoms, creating an electric current.* But this form of electricity can't power your home. Under typical UK conditions, 1m² of PV panel will produce around 100kWh electricity per year, so it would take around 2.5 years to "pay back" the energy cost of the panel. PV panels have an expected life of least 25 to 30 years, so even under UK conditions a PV panel will generate many times more energy than was needed to manufacture it.
