

Why is Mozambique a major energy exporter?

Mozambique is a net exporter of energy to countries in the Southern African Power Pool (SAPP) - South Africa being the largest importer. The government view energy exports as a key driver of the Mozambican economy, having passed a new electricity law that simplifies permitting and encourages IPPs activities.

What energy sources are available in Mozambique?

Mozambique has abundant energy sources available for exploitation. As of 2021, the country was ranked first in energy potential of all the countries in the Southern African Power Pool (SAPP), with an estimated energy capacity of 187,000 MW. Available energy sources include coal, hydroelectricity, natural gas, solar energy and wind power.

Economic development in low-income countries like Mozambique relies heavily on expanding agricultural and industrial production. This expansion requires substantial infrastructure development and increased energy consumption, which can lead to environmental degradation through deforestation, pollution, and greenhouse gas emissions.

Does Mozambique have deforestation?

Mozambique experienced significant deforestation between 2000-2022, with provinces losing an average of 21% of their tree coverage, particularly in central regions and Zambezia province. Despite deforestation, most regions maintain negative net forest carbon emissions, indicating forests still sequester more carbon than they emit.
