A typical utility-scale battery storage system, on the other hand, is rated in megawatts and hours of duration, such as Tesla's Mira Loma Battery Storage Facility, which has a rated capacity of 20 megawatts and a 4-hour duration (meaning it can store 80 megawatt-hours of usable electricity).
