Solar power has its drawbacks (like the eco-cost of manufacturing the panels and the end of life disposal process), but it's much, much greener to install solar panels on your roof than it is to cover massive acres of land with them, essentially condemning large portions of ground to barrenness.

On a pitched roof, panels should not be installed above the highest part of the roof (excluding the chimney) and should project no more than 200mm from the roof slope or wall surface. On a flat roof, the highest part of the solar PV equipment should not be more than 600mm higher than the highest part of the roof (excluding chimney).

Do I Need Permission to Install Solar Panels on My Roof? In most cases, no, you do not need to apply for planning permission to install solar panels on your roof. Typically, it's considered permitted development and shouldn't affect neighbours in any meaningful way. After all, you aren't expanding your property.

A good surveyor should do a technical site survey including looking at roof orientation, measuring roof tilt, assessing roof quality (inside and out), recording any risks of shade on the panels (taking into account how this will change over time and at different times of the day and year), looking at your consumer unit and metering, asking about your electricity use (and when you use it), and ...

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The average home needs 8 to 13 panels for a 4kW system to cover its electricity needs (2,700kWh annually on average).; A 2 bedroom house requires 4 to 8 panels, a 3 bedroom house needs between 8 and 13 panels, while a 4 or 5 bedroom household in the UK will need 13 to 16 solar panels, on average depending on household energy consumption and the wattage ...

How much space do I need to install solar panels? The space you need will depend entirely on the size of the panel. Keep in mind that the bigger the panel, the more electricity it will generate. Each solar panel is around 1.3 - 1.7 m². The most common size for your panel is 1.6 m².
